



## From Great Depths 3D experience Years 3-12

Witness the wrecks of HMAS *Sydney* (II) and HSK *Kormoran* as they currently lie, 2,500m deep on the ocean floor, through a sequence of extraordinary high quality 2D and 3D images. *From Great Depths* is a poignant exhibit exploring the history of both ships and the exact moment they engage in battle off the West Australian coast.

Screenings of *From Great Depths* can be complemented by a visit to the HMAS *Sydney* II Memorial.

## Shipwrecks Gallery tour Years 6-12

Be immersed in a 30-minute guided tour of the Museum's celebrated Shipwrecks Gallery, featuring the stories of the *Zeewijk*, *Zuytdorp*, *Gilt Dragon*, and the ill-fated *Batavia*. Topics covered include 17th Century trade, transport, and navigation; human survival and conflict; and modern maritime archaeology.

## Museum Trails

Non-Readers (2-8yo) & Readers (8yo+)

Every object tells a story with the Mid West Gallery trail, as you wind your way through the region's natural and social history. Or try the Wajarri Wangga trail and discover the importance of Wajarri language, the most widely spoken Aboriginal language in the Greater Geraldton area.

Trails are also available for non-readers.

## Self-guided experiences

The museum is always available for self-guided school visits that are either teacher-led or invite students to browse the Museum independently and discover exciting stories.
