The Western Australian Museum Boola Bardip is a vibrant centre of inspiration, learning and enjoyment for everyone. It preserves, documents and shares collections relating to the State's natural and cultural heritage. Our organisation collaborates with people across Western Australia to share the stories and voices of diverse communities. We work alongside national and international organisations, contributing to global research, promoting life-long learning, and developing and hosting world-class exhibitions.

About the program

As part of our commitment to being an accessible Museum, the West Australian Museum - Boola Bardip is currently seeking to partner with aged care service providers to partner with us during the 2023/24 financial year.

Footsteps aim to increase and enrich the accessibility of the Museum to Older Australians who may find it daunting to attend the museum solo for reasons of mobility, practicality and/or requiring company during their visit. The program is designed primarily to engage this community on a deeper, more accessible level with the gallery content at Boola Bardip and increase guests' engagement in this specific demographic. Having experienced a successful pilot phase with high engagement and stakeholder satisfaction results, this program will now be available to service providers through an expression of interest process.

The successful partner and their participants will be offered bi-monthly (excluding school holidays) facilitated visits, incorporating a selection of our eight permanent galleries, making them accessible in a level-appropriate yet engaging and enjoyable manner for the guests who partake in the program. Our program can accommodate between 10 and 15 participants and their support workers.

The quarterly sessions will take about 2 hours each and will be held during Museum opening hours, on any weekday, by negotiation with our successful partner organisation. Sessions will be facilitated by trained staff and members of our volunteer team.

As a condition of participation, Footsteps attendees will be required to join as concession members of Boola Bardip at \$10 per person (membership can be organised on behalf of participating individuals by their service provider), entitling them to unlimited general admission to the museum for 12 months thereafter.

About you

The successful service provider will be expected to:

- Be a registered NDIS provider specialising in aged care.

- Commit to bi-monthly sessions for a period of 12 months.
- Provide adequate support worker-to-client ratio.

- Have you previously applied for this program?

- How many active members does your program service?
- You are actively engaged in other NDIS-approved programs. Please detail the nature of these programs and your current level of commitment.
- You meet the required 4:1 client-to-support worker ratio.
- You can commit to a minimum of 10 clients attending each session.
- Can commit to the purchase of concession membership for each participant at the cost of \$10 per person.
