- 3 Tell your readers what your news is about.
- 4 Write a second story with a headline.

## IS IT NEWSWORTHY?

### Impact

How will this story affect people? Will it change their lives in any way?

### Timeliness

How recent is this news? Is it something that just happened, or is it old news? If it's not new, it's not news.

### Prominence

Does this story involve someone or something that is well-known?

### Proximity

Does this story affect people who live in the local area? If it's news in WA, it's in *The West*.

### Novelty/oddity

Is this story unusual or unexpected? Does it make people stop and think?

### Conflict

Does this story involve a conflict of some sort?

### Currency

Is this story still relevant? Is it something that people are still talking about?

### Human interest

Does this story appeal to people's emotions? Does it make them feel something?

4 **Farmers plea for carve-outs from cultural heritage laws**

Grain farmers claim WA's new heritage laws risk "the demise of regional communities and industries" while pleading for land that has "already been disturbed, developed or cultivated" to be exempt from the Act.

WA Grains Group Inc — which represents the State's cereal growers — also wants the State Government to foot the bill for Aboriginal cultural heritage surveys and commis-

sion a "Statewide survey of freehold land... as a matter of urgency".

The requests were laid out in a letter sent by the group to Premier Roger Cook and Aboriginal Affairs Minister Tony Bligh this week.

The correspondence points out the refreshed Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act — which came into effect on July 1 — comes at the same time as moves to ban live sheep exports, ramp up restrictions on firearms ownership and in the midst of a cost-of-living crisis.

Combined, WAGG fears the changes "have the capacity to destroy our otherwise resilient industries".
