# GOLDFIELDS ABORIGINAL HISTORY AND CULTURE

**Years 4–7** | Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures

A guest Aboriginal presenter will then share their experiences, and students can learn more about the richness and diversity of Aboriginal culture in the Goldfields through hands-on activities.
