- You should be at least 13 or above to use the PICO device.
- Virtual reality experiences may not be the best fit for everyone, if you experience any discomfort, stop using the device immediately.
- Consult a doctor before using if you are pregnant, elderly, or have serious physical, mental, visual, or heart problems.
- Some people may feel dizzy, nauseous, lightheaded, or experience disorientation, or other symptoms when using the device.
- People with photosensitive epilepsy could have seizures, triggered by flashing or blinking displays.
- Some people may be allergic to plastic, PU, fabric, and other materials used in this product.
