



External building works fact sheet and FAQs

What is the project?

The project involves replacing sections of cladding around key egress points on the exterior of the WA Maritime Museum (the Museum).

How long will the project take?

The project will take place from April to September 2026 (pending site progress).

Will the Museum stay open?

The Museum will remain open to the public for the duration of the project.

The public will still be able to access the Museum through the main entrance.

Will the café inside the Museum stay open?

The Caffissimo café will remain open to the public for the duration of the project.

The café's outdoor seating area will be fenced off when cladding replacement works are carried out in that area. The café will still be accessible from inside the Museum during this time.

Will there be noise and dust?

Minimal dust is expected as the works do not involve concrete cutting or earth movement.

Varying levels of noise may be present; however, every effort will be made to ensure there are no disruptions for Museum visitors and staff.

All noise and dust will be managed in accordance with the Construction Management Plan.

What areas of the Museum will be affected?

The contractor will work in sections around the building's exterior, beginning at the front (east facing), then proceeding to the river side (north facing), and finishing in the boardwalk area (west facing).
